

2 Kings 6:1-7 (ESV)

6:1,2 The sons of the prophets said to Elisha, "See, the place where we dwell under your charge is too small for us. Let us go to the Jordan and each of us get there a log, and let us make a place for us to dwell there". And he answered, "Go".

6:3 Then one of them said, "Be pleased to go with your servants". And he answered, I will go".

INSIGHT: The sons of the prophets refer to members of spiritual learners who are being mentored by Elisha. The students see the need for a bigger place to house them and Elisha agreed to their plan.

In the same way in our church, we see needs arising as we serve together. It is a blessing to witness people in our faith community planning, coordinating and striving together to meet a specific need.

In acknowledgement of Elisha's availability, the students asked their teacher to accompany them. And because Elisha cared for his earnest students, he went with them. His presence encourages them. There are times when it is our presence and not words that make a great difference in a situation.

In cutting trees, the borrowed axe's head fell into the water. The students had borrowed the axe as it was too expensive for them to purchase one. They would have to pay off the value as a bondservant should they lose or break the borrowed axe.

Telling Elisha about the problem is like us telling God our concerns and problems. God performed a miracle through Elisha when his students came to him. In the same way, when we look to God in faith and humility, He is faithful to give us His answers in His time and in His way.

- *其中有一人砍樹時,不慎斧頭掉進水裡,非常驚慌,因那把 斧頭是借的。門徒告訴以利沙,神便藉著以利沙行神跡。
- 同樣,當我們遇到問題,我們要憑信心,謙卑地向神求助。祂是信實的, 必照著祂的時間、方法回應我們的禱告。讓我們在主裡同心協力,一起為拓展 神的國度邁進。

2022 SERMON SERIES

It is my privilege to be part of the preaching ministry at Cebu Gospel Church for a number of years already, together with other Bible expositors and faithful preachers (veteran and young preachers alike). The ministry of the Word is indeed foundational for and indispensable to the growth and edification of the body of Christ. We put premium on this because we firmly believe in the reformation doctrine of Sola Scriptura, which means that the inspired and inerrant Scripture alone is the final authority for faith and practice.

The series of sermons preached every Sunday since the beginning of this year 2022 is connected with and reflecting the various aspects of the theme "Together We Thrive in Christ." This theme highlights God's expectation of his people to grow, to improve, to thrive (not just survive) in ALL aspects of life. But this thriving is to be done in the context of the faith community/church. In other words, it is a communal journey/thriving, not just an individual journey/thriving. Thus, the emphasis on togetherness. And all these thriving are grounded in a dynamic relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ ("in Christ"). As Jesus himself declared, "... apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). Paul also testified, "I can do all things through him [Christ] who strengthens me" (Phil. 3:13 ESV)

We started the year with sermons exhorting us to thrive in loving God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength (Deut. 6:1-9 & Mark 12:28-30). Since God is the most important person in our life, and because loving God with all our being is the greatest commandment, then every believer should thrive in this area. Additionally, we were also challenged to thrive in loving our neighbor as we love ourselves (Matt. 22:36-40).

As believers, we strive to be what God wants us to be (Col. 3:12-14), especially in loving God and in loving others.

For four Sundays we were also reminded and challenged to thrive in the area of giving. We learned about having a heavenly perspective on wealth, the five ways to please God in our giving, the various lifestyle characteristics that God rewards, and the wonderful blessings that God imparts to the faithful stewards. It is evident that CGC excels in the grace of giving and is thriving in this area. We hope and pray that as we continue to respond to God's grace and persevere in the faith that this attitude towards and practice in giving will also continue for the furtherance of God's work within CGC and beyond the four walls of this church.

We recognize that on our own strength we cannot live the Christian life victoriously (Gal. 5:19-21) and cannot manufacture the fruit of the Spirit within us (Gal. 5:22-23). So, for two months or so we meditated on why we need to be totally dependent on the Holy Spirit to fill us and empower us. When a church thrives in living a Spirit-filled life, the fruit of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control) will become evident in our lives and significantly and positively affect the relationships within the body of Christ.

And those who are thriving in living a Spirit-filled life will also be thriving in loving the church. Because of that we spent at least seven Sundays of exhortations on how we can tangibly express our love for the church. As John commands, "Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth" (1 John 3:18 ESV).

So, CGC was exhorted to thrive in loving the church by washing one another's feet, serving one another, being humble toward each, being devoted to one another, not grumbling among one another, being at peace with one another, and regarding one another as more important than one's self.

As we thrive in loving the church (a bigger community), we must also thrive in our domestic affairs or household relationships. This will ensure that our public expression of faith is consistent with how we live out our faith at home. In this regard we were challenged and encouraged to seek ways and do positive things that will improve husband-wife relationship, parent-child relationship, as well as the overall household dynamics (Col. 3:18-4:1). It is our prayer and desire that each family at CGC is strengthened and consistently growing in the Lord.

One of the factors why some Christians are not thriving in Christ is because they do not know how to wrestle against the spiritual enemies and withstand in the evil day. That is why it is important for CGC members to be reminded about the role of the spiritual warfare in the believer's life so that each one will thrive (not just survive) in the fight against the evil forces of Satan (1 Peter 5:8-9). So, we were exhorted to guard our heart from temptations (lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, pride of life) and to guard our stand by knowing and wearing the full armor of God (Eph. 6:10-20). When believers do these as well as continue to abide in Christ (John 15), we can be strong in the Lord and stand firm in the midst of the enemy's attacks.

One potent way the enemies attack the church is by tempting us to be self-focused and not care about the edification of the body of Christ. This happens when believers do not use their God-given spiritual gifts to serve one another. We do not want this to happen at CGC. That is why we spent at least three Sundays to unwrap/unpack the various serving, leading, and speaking gifts (Rom. 12:3-8; 1 Cor. 12:7-11) so that we would be encouraged and challenged to discover our individual gifts and use them to glorify God and to build up our faith community. We hope and pray that we too are thriving in this area.

The month of October is the Missions month at CGC, and we were reminded and challenged to thrive in reaching the world. We heard sermons about how to become a magnetic church and to continue to proclaim and demonstrate the gospel wherever we are. CGC is indeed thriving in the area of gospel partnerships as you continue to pray and financially invest for the missionaries you have adopted and other gospel ministries in the Philippines and outside the country. May you continue to obey our Great Savior who has given us the Great Commission (Matt. 28:16-20) for his global glory.

November is known as the thanksgiving month. And so, the sermon series is about thriving in THANKSGIVING, exhorting believers about grateful living both in good times and in bad times. As we anticipate the Christmas season in December, we can expect the sermons to reflect the deeper reason and purpose of Christ's incarnation so we can continue to live in the light of that truth.

IAs you may have noticed, we have gone through a more systematic kind of spiritual feeding as the messages are connected with the main theme for this year. It is God's will that each one of us will put into practice the things that we have heard from the exposition of God's word (James 1:22). And I continue to encourage each one to yield to the Spirit's control and power daily for He is the one who will give us both the desire and the ability to obey.

By God's sustaining grace, let us continue to be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord our labor is not in vain (1 Cor. 15:58 ESV). Amen!




Thriving Community

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, many of us were forced to stay home, sheltering ourselves from crowd, including in-person worship services. This decision was forced upon us by the government's lock down policies not only on our borders but also upon business and social establishments including churches. It became evident that any gathering apart from people living in the same household, is not allowed. For some families, it was a positive thing to be together; but for some, it was "forced" upon them to be together. Many families did not only survive but thrive during the pandemic. Family members huddled together for comfort, for encouragement amid uncertainties. The lock down period gave some families more occasions to share stories, took meals together, played and socialized together. Family camaraderie was fostered.


Centuries earlier, around AD 33, after the apostles received the Holy Spirit during the day of Pentecost, Peter began to preach boldly to the crowd gathered for the feast. That day, many believed Peter's message of salvation in Jesus Christ. Thus, the church was born. The church composed of all believers in Jesus Christ, began to gather for prayer, Bible study, fellowship, breaking of bread, etc. This community became a "force" to reckon with because people took notice of them - their faith was translated into action of generous giving and sharing, such that no one was found to be in need. The Christ-followers' life witness and lifestyle were so attractive that people flocked to the community wanting to know more about this way of Jesus Christ.

According to secular historian Rodney Stark, Christianity grew exponentially from its inception, at the astonishing growth rate of 40 percent per decade. The figure below gives a clear illustration of the rapid growth (Smith, p. 30). What can account for such a growth rate, especially the danger involved in being a Christ-follower during this era? According to Smith (p. 30), he heard many explanations but one that he found most appealing was that the lives Christians were living were so winsome that others simply wanted to have what they had.



Fast forward 2022, do our churches (not the buildings) attract people? Do people outside want to flock to our community - CGC or MGC? Are we a community that is attractive to the outside world? What will it take us to become winsome that others simply will want to have what we have? Smith (2010) offers eight (8) ways of how a community of believers can be both good and beautiful or simply said, blessings to the world around us. I believe that these also are the characteristics of what a thriving community of believers is. Here in this article, I am sharing only the tip of the iceberg from his book, and I have chosen only the first four (4) of the eight (8), hoping that after reading this article, it will whet your appetite to get a copy and read. If interested, I can lend you my copy, just let me know.





1. PECULIAR COMMUNITY

When somebody says that you are "peculiar," take it as a compliment because that's how scriptures described Jesus' followers. Dictionaries define peculiar as "distinctive," "odd," "strange" and weird." In short, peculiar means different. Christians are different from the ordinary, from the common, from what is the norm. Jesus' teachings were peculiar because it was not the norm. Ex. "You have heard that it was said, you shall not murder... but I say to you... (Matthew 5:21-22). Further on, Jesus said "you have heard that it was said, you shall love your neighbor, and hate your enemy, But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you; bless those who curse you," (Matthew 5:43-44). Jesus also said, "For whoever wishes to save his life shall lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake, he is the one who will save it." (Luke 9:24). There are many more hard sayings that are so different from what the world considers as the normal and acceptable. Yet, because our God is a peculiar God, it follows that the church must also be peculiar. How different are our ways from those of the world? Or are we so blended into the world that the world hardly notices the difference? Paul challenged believers to not conform to the patterns of this world but to be transformed. What must the church do to be different from the rest of the world? Do we dare to be different and be branded as "peculiar"?

2. HOPEFUL COMMUNITY

During the COVID-19 pandemic, where was the church? How did the church respond to the pandemic? Was the church also as fearful as many of the people were? Was the church desperate and hopeless? Our God is a God of hope. Smith (pp. 49-51) unpacked four parts of the story of hope which is also the story of the church - all centered in Jesus. The story of hope starts with Jesus' death that every believer partook upon receiving Him as Savior and Lord of our lives. Jesus' death gives us hope of sins forgiven and the dying of our old self on the cross. Secondly, the story of hope brings us to Jesus' resurrection which is the foundation of our faith. The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the same power that now resides in us which allow all Christ-followers to live a new life (2 Corinthians 5:17). The third part is Christ's ascension. We do not think much about the significance of Jesus' ascension. But this part is important because it gives us the "present" perspective of Christ - where he is and what he is doing. Colossians 3:1 "If you have been raised up with Christ, keep seeking the things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God." Today, Jesus is enthroned as the supreme Lord of all. Jesus reigns - He is Lord! The posture we see is that of Jesus seated, which implies that his work is complete. By setting our hearts on things above, we are to focus on the finished work of Christ which is our source of hope and strength. Finally, the fourth part of the story is Christ's return which has not occurred; yet His return is our ultimate hope for all things to be made right and our joy will be complete. This hope binds all Christ-followers together as we await the final consummation of God's plan for the ages.

For who is the greater, one who reclines at table or one who serves? Is it not the one who reclines at table? But! am among you as the one who serves.

Luke 22:27

3. SERVING COMMUNITY

Jesus came to serve and not to be served. If the story of hope is centered on Jesus Christ, the story of a serving community is focused on others. The serving community is the "others-centered" community. As Jesus is, so are his followers. Jesus was a servant. He lived for the good of others. Greatness in our world is defined by power, position, and possessions. Jesus reversed this notion of greatness. "Who is the greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves" (Luke 22:27). The King of all things, the Creator of the universe, comes to serve. He lives to serve. How can CGC and MGC do this? We become others-centered when we understand that our faith community is an "outpost of the kingdom of God" (Smith, p. 72). It is never about us, but it is about God's kingdom. "The value of a church is not in its longevity but in its love. The success of a church is not in its size but in its service to the people and the community. We are a people founded by a person who never established a church, built a building, or led a finance campaign to build impressive buildings. Our leader just came and served and then died for the good of others" (Smith, pp. 72-73).

4.CHRIST-CENTERED COMMUNITY

Jesus prayed that all believers may be one. But the awful truth is that the church of Jesus Christ has been split into many different factions who refused to have fellowship with one another. For a people who claim to be one body and one Spirit, one Lord, one faith and one baptism, one God and Father of all, we are not one church but exist in isolation, judgment, suspicion, and condemnation. This is sad and undoubtedly this grieves God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit (Smith, p. 90). Our division instead of unity are founded on three areas: race, gender, and class, as implied in Galatians 3:28 which states, "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." But this verse also clearly gives us the basis for our unity - we are ONE IN CHRIST Christ is in every believer, changing our fundamental identity without eradicating our differences - men are still men, women are still women; by ethnicity, Chinese will remain Chinese, Filipinos will remain Filipinos; slaves are still slaves when they step outside of this "Christ-follower community." The solution to gender, race and social divisions is not to eradicate our differences but to see them in light of Christ. The true source of our "unity in diversity" is the Trinity -Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; distinct from one another yet, mutually indwelling and mutually interdependent (Smith, pp. 98-99)..

Amidst the COVID-19 threat, will CGC and MGC rise to the challenge and thrive? Will Cebu Gospel Church and Mandaue Gospel Church be known by the outside world as a church that stands out because of our "un-worldly" thinking and behaving? Can we be hope bearers because of our faith in Christ's death, resurrection, ascension, and return? Will our church be known for how promptly we respond to disasters because we are always willing to lay down our needs to take care of another? Are we so Christ-centered that we welcome anyone in Christ, who breaks down all barriers that tend to separate people? To the surprise of many, as John saw in a vision, we too shall behold this glorious scene in heaven - "a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb.... Crying out with a loud voice "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" (Revelation 6:10).

I would pick one bible verse from either the Bible app on my phone or my Daily Bread, sometimes, I would just flip to a page in the Bible and randomly pick a verse to memorize. During the last week of our finals, for some unknown reason, I decided to look back at the verses I had memorized. Then something caught my eye. Clustered all on the page of the week of my finals were the verses:

Over the years and into the pandemic, whenever I hear about ALS, my thoughts drift back to the lunch meeting and I wonder how he's been doing lately. I've prayed for him a couple of times but the thought of how grave his case is, made me doubt myself. I have been asking our mutual friends his medical condition, but they, too, have no updates on him.

Oftentimes, praying for me, is like a task waiting to be crossed out in my to-do list or a mindless endeavor to be fulfilled, thinking that God might only listen to those who love Him more or those who are more actively involved with church ministries. It was hard to believe that one day I'd come across the good news that he had found Jesus Christ! He has found solace in his Savior not only for himself but with his family. Although his condition isn't getting any better, it makes me happy knowing that he finally knows the Almighty God who is our Miracle Worker.

This experience is a wake-up call for me. In the many times we pray to God, we tend to think He has more problems in His hands to consider our pleas. This time God reminds me that He listens to my every prayer. No prayer is too small and insignificant for Him. The Apostle Paul reminds us in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17 to "pray without ceasing" because in fact, Jesus told us to keep on asking, keep on seeking, and keep on knocking in Matthew 7:7.

As I share this story to my family, I realize that some things might seem impossible, but everything happens according to God's ultimate plan. It was hard for me to believe that one day my acquaintance would know the Lord in the midst of suffering from an 'incurable disease', but God works in mysterious ways and He always keeps His promises. He is indeed a Promise Keeper.


KEEP ON!

Jesus said, "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed planted in a field" (Matthew 13:31). The mustard seed (not the mustard herb we grow in our vegetable garden) is the smallest of all seeds in Palestine during the biblical time. But when grown, it is the biggest of all plants, growing up to 12 feet high and birds build their nest on it. Small but when planted, the size of the plant is astoundingly huge. "Small" very often ends up "big." A paradox but this is how God usually operates.

God's work often starts very small. From one man, Noah, came the nations. From one couple beyond child-bearing age, Abraham and Sarah, came God's chosen nation. From one man, Jacob, came the twelve tribes of Israel. From one shepherd, came the greatest king of God's chosen nation, and from whom also came the King of kings and Lord of lords, the promised Messiah of the Jews, and the Savior of the world - Jesus.

Christianity was started from the humble arrival of this one baby in a manger. Raised as a carpenter's son in Nazareth, his life, sacrificial death, and miraculous resurrection, made a remarkable impact on the twelve ordinary men he chose. The twelve turned the world upside down and made Christianity the largest and fastest growing movement in the world today. Small and insignificant beginnings yet it leads to enormous impact. God's kingdom has never stopped growing and increasing.



The parable of the mustard seed gives us at least three important kingdom principles that will encourage us whether as individual Christians or as a body of Christ - the church.

1. The mustard seed needs to be planted in the ground.

To be planted in the ground implies obscurity and death. The seed needs to be hidden in the ground for a time before you see it grow. In the ground implies dying. Unless the Christian dies to self, dies to the world, and to the flesh, the Christian will not grow. For it is in dying that the Christian lives. Jesus said it succinctly, "Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds" (John 12:24).

Hidden and dying also imply humility. The body of Christ or the church must put to death all works of the flesh - divisiveness, partiality, pride, envy, covetousness, evil desire, malice, slander, etc. Instead, put on love, kindness, gentleness, forgiving spirit, patience, etc. It is by these Christlike qualities that the world will know that we are Christ-followers "This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples" (John 15:8).

2. The mustard seed's growth is exponential.

When the mustard seed is grown, its growth is remarkably huge. Such is the kingdom of God. Small beginning yet in the end, many nations will be gathered within it. The Apostle John in Revelation 7:9 wrote, "Behold, a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation and all tribes and peoples and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, and palm branches were in their hands."

In the last 100 years, the number of Christians in the world has quadrupled from about 600 million in 1910 to well past 2 billion presently. Today, Christianity remains the world's largest religious group. According to the Pew Research Center, in 2015, there were 2.3 billion Christians of all ages living in the world. The Center for the Study of Global Christianity (CSGC) at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, reported that the number of Christians in the world edged past 2.5 billion in 2019 (learnreligions.com). Globally, Christianity is growing at a 1.27% rate while the world's population, 7.7 billion, is growing at a 1.20% rate (www.barna.com).

3. The mustard seed needs time to grow.

Lifted from the pages of Chris Tiegreen's One Year Heaven on Earth Devotional (2016, July 18), is the following write up - "High in the Andes Mountains, a plant known as the puya raimondii or the Queen of the Andes - grows to more than 30 feet and can live well over 100 years. But the plant flowers only once - at the end of its life, which is sometime between 80 to 150 years of age in the wild. In other words, it takes a really long time for anyone to see its stunning beauty."

In God's Kingdom, our investment in time, treasures, talent do not always bear visible fruit after a while. In fact, many times we need to be extremely patient and persistent in gospel efforts, discipleship, and mission's agenda. Our prayers may not see any answers; the works of our hands may not be producing results; our random acts of kindness and compassion may not be making any difference; yet all these spiritual exercises will eventually yield its fruit.

Paul in 1 Corinthians 15:58 resonates this kingdom principle - (paraphrasing) stay strong, stick with whatever you are doing in the Body of Christ. Don't get discourage, don't give up but keep serving, keep loving, keep giving, keep teaching, keep reaching out, all for Jesus - because you know that after a while and sometimes, after a long while, your work will be rewarded. You will see prayers answered, lives transformed, hearts fired up for Jesus. The church of Jesus Christ will thrive because this is already prophesied and affirmed by Jesus when he said, "I will build my church, and the gates of Hades shall not overpower it" (Matthew 16:18b).



The internet allowed the members to continue attending Sunday worship and to have fellowship with each other, albeit virtually. Moreover, it also brought the Word of God to different people, believers and unbelievers, in various parts of the world.



The church strived to stay in touch with its members by regularly checking up on their well-being and visiting their homes during the Christmas season. For the departed members, the church managed to conduct face-to-face internment programs.

Towards the end of 2021, the church faced another trial as Typhoon Odette lashed the city.

By the Grace of God, the church withstood the typhoon with minimal damage. Through the efforts of its members, the damages were addressed and regular virtual activities quickly resumed as soon as the power was restored.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

YEAR 2022 GILBERT YAP

t is without a doubt that the Covid-19 Pandemic has changed our lives, confining and immobilizing us to our homes, hindering us from going about our daily activities like we used to. The new normal was indeed a challenge, especially for the missions committee. It hindered our main line of work, missions.

Despite this hurdle, Cebu Gospel Church's Mission committee still pressed on to complete and accomplish what we are called to do. With 57 years of service, even during the pandemic, Cebu Gospel Church still continues to support these missionaries, both active and potential ones. Currently supporting 10 active missionaries and 30 students studying to be either pastors or missionaries, the missions committee supports them financially to encourage and sustain them in their calling to be vessels in spreading the Good News.

Cebu Gospel Church's Missions committee is also an active partner with the care caravan of CCOWEF (Chinese Congress on World Evangelization Fellowship Philippines) an organization that aims to share the Gospel to unreached places. Our partnership with them is most active, especially during the occurrence of natural calamities. Just last September of 2022, during Typhoon Karding, we provided them with financial support for their relief operations in Luzon. Likewise, when Cebu was hit with the devastating Typhoon Odette in December of last year, we personally experienced God's grace, love and deliverance through the care caravan's relief goods which included water and other basic necessities that were, at that time, scarce.

However, our work does not stop there. Since September 2022, we, together with CAMACOP (Christian and Missionary Alliance Churches of the Philippines), are conducting children feeding programs in 13 sites around Cebu. With an estimate of more than 1300 children every week and a food budget of P12.50 for each child, we plan to continue sharing the Word of God with them in the hopes that they will take inspiration from these Bible stories and dedicate their lives to serving the Lord.

As an active member in the Missions committee for more than 15 years, I can personally see God's faithfulness and goodness in the work that we do. He constantly provides us with the material, financial, and human resources, as well as spiritual guidance to support and successfully accomplish not only our work as the Missions committee but also the field work of other missionaries. The execution of the Missions committee's projects is fully grounded in the goal of sharing the Gospel and bringing more souls to Christ. Through this, we hope to continue expanding our support to more missionaries as well as reach out to more places that need to hear the Good News.

COMMITTEE

Those who live in the shelter of the Most High will find rest in the shadow of the Almighty. This I declare about the Lord: He alone is my refuge, my place of safety; he is my God, and I trust him." Psalm 91: 1 - 2

When the pandemic hit two years ago, this became our current source of hope. Our hearts and minds were filled with fears, worries, anxious thoughts, depression, desperation, and uncertainty about the days ahead. However, the psalmist reminds us that if we would only rest in the shadows of our God Almighty, we would be safe. The Psalmist exhorts us to place all of our reliance in Christ alone because He is our fortress and a constant source of support. We also urge our members to uphold this commitment throughout the pandemic.



Ministries were temporarily suspended at that time. It forces churches to consider alternatives to face-to-face ministry in order to continue to uplift and support its people. Because the majority of our members don't have internet connection, it presents a number of difficulties for us. By the grace of God, we are able to assist them by purchasing loads just for their Bible study via Messenger, and it is effective. We were able to minister to them weekly and have witnessed their dedication and thirst for God's Word.



Then God provided us some people who are eager to assist the families who were severely affected by the pandemic, and we were able to give them some groceries. In doing so, we also fulfilled our mission as a church, which was to lead and disciple the church members holistically as well as spiritually.


Another ministry opportunity presented itself when a fraternity approached us and requested assistance for their community pantry. They gave us the permission to take part by leading them in prayer and distributing 160 Bibles to those who received food from the pantry.

Then Typhoon Odette struck, wreaking havoc on our area. Some of our members lost their homes, while others had nothing left, not even clothes or food. The Christian and Missionary Alliance Churches of the Philippines, Inc. (CAMACOP) sent assistance to the typhoon's hardest-hit areas, and we were one of the recipients. The families received assistance from the church in the form of cooking supplies and food that would allow them to survive. And we give thanks to God because, despite the fact that we were in the midst of these calamities, God provided a way for the church to act and contribute to the community. And as a result of those opportunities, many people accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior, others were encouraged, and the gospel was spread. And thus, following the pandemic and the typhoon, 31 people have made the decision to follow Jesus through water baptism.

It's been two years since the pandemic began, and nearly a year since Typhoon Odette struck. The people to whom we have ministered requested that we begin our Sunday services in the neighborhood. And as of today, we thank the Lord for allowing us to be a part of His ministry here in Cordova. Our church now has around 100 members, ranging in age from children to adults, and we regularly gather in the Barangay gymnasium to worship.

Worries, problems, doubts, challenges, crisis is natural even in the Christian world. Covid-19 turned the world upside down. Restrictions, financial crisis, food problems, and spiritual challenges to name a few. All of these happened beyond our expectation. But for us, it is an opportunity to share the word of God and to build our relationship with our neighbors. It is also our time to share whatever we may have to the glorify His name.

Our worship service may have been affected but through technology, we find new ways of gathering simply to continue to worship the Lord. As it is written in the Bible, God assures us and promises us that He is always with us. No matter what we are going through, He has assured us that our end point will be with Him in a place where there is no more mourning, crying or pain. Now, they encouraged us to start the Sunday worship again even without a proper shelter. The Lord has moved kind hearted people to help us build the church again, slowly but surely.

The pandemic and Super Typhoon Odette never hindered God's work in Sogod, Southern Leyte.

We could not deny the fact that the pandemic brought about changes. Business establishments were temporary closed, and some declared bankruptcy. At the same time, the churches closed. Our ministry started in October 2018 and one of our challenges was to connect with people. The COVID-19 pandemic gave us this opportunity to connect with families. We were blessed with groceries and with these blessings, we shared with other families. Through this, we were able to encourage them with the Word of God. We thank God with the one family who responded to the call of the Lord. Last June 12, 2021, they were baptized, and dedicated their children to the Lord as well. What a blessing.

During the pandemic, we established a Bible Study group composed of men at RDex Farm. A few months later, we were having Sunday worship service already. We were moved to include the family members of these men; and so, we scheduled Sunday Worship for parents and Junior Worship for their children every Thursday.

Unfortunately, the Super Typhoon Odette hit us last December 16, 2021, and wiped out our fellowship center. We had to put all our activities on hold and felt discouraged and anxious. How can we start over and where can we get financial assistance?

In times like these, we see and feel God's amazing grace. He has provided what we needed for the rebuilding our fellowship center. We believe that "God gives, God takes away and God replaces" As the scripture says,

There are only five females in the class among more than thirty pastors, including our missionaries. Every Monday at 8:00pm, we have our DBS (Discovery Bible Study) with some Young Professionals to train them for discipleship. On Wednesday mornings, Sia BokSu, Ptr. Andy, Merly and I meet for our discussion and prayer time for TNet.



I praise and thank God for sustaining me

as I continue my role in being the Children Ministry Coordinator of OM Cebu, taking care of our six outreach areas in the lowlands and even in the highlands.

We have resumed our weekly activities with the children and teens. In fact, the numbers have increased. Thank God that Christ the Living Water Harvest Church has partnered with us and welcomed our teens from the Umapad community into their church. They pick them up and bring them home. Having gone through their discipleship program, seven of the teens were baptized just recently.

And now, they are on fire to serve the Lord. Sensing the need to equip and train these teens who have grown spiritually from the outreaches, we organized an OUTREACH TEENS LEADERSHIP TRAINING for all the teens in our six outreaches. We also invited some volunteers from our partner churches. Thank God that Bradford Church opened its door for our use last June 30 and July 1 - two full days of learning, sharing, fun and prayer. We even had someone share the gospel to them after which they were also taught how to share the gospel to others. Thank God for those who did accept Jesus into their lives during the training.















During the Holy Week this year, we were able to invite our outreach teens to Bradford's WALKTHRU held in Ayala Central Bloc. Here, they had a personal encounter with Jesus as they went through the stations reflecting on the events that led to Jesus' death and resurrection. I also volunteered to help in this event as a watcher and counselor.





Last month, when the team of ten from Singapore Bible College came to visit, we went to the mountains of Bonbon to bring the love and hope of Jesus to fifty children. We taught them songs, Bible stories, played with them and shared the gospel to them using the five-color bead bracelet. Many received Jesus. We also had painting activity wherein they portrayed "What is LOVE" for them.





We did not have much material things to give away but only some items from Colgate-Palmolive which I was tasked to dispose. We were able to distribute almost one thousand boxes of wipes and handwash to ten outreaches and at least fifteen partner churches and para church organizations.

Finally, at the end of June, we conducted a VBS Training for our outreach volunteers at TLCC. We also had volunteers from our partner churches. Our theme for this year was WALK IN THE LIGHT.

He has given us many opportunities to share His blessings to His people. May the Lord use us mightily to be channels of His love and hope to the lost. Let us not be weary in doing good. . . . God knows and He will reward our every good deed. Let us continue to partner together for the expansion of His kingdom. he pandemic has posed numerous challenges to all of us. Some of us are in a better position to handle the transitions, while others are struck with sicknesses, departure of family members, loss of jobs, unable to continue their businesses, and finding it hard to support their families and making ends meet.

In the past year, Membership Committee (Mem-Com) met regularly to survey the needs of the church membership and to find ways to serve those needs. With the use of Welfare Fund, MemCom continues to offer assistance to some members who need financial aid with their regular medical maintenance. Some members are provided with assistance for their hospitalizations and surgeries, and some members or their children are granted tuition subsidies to continue their education at PCGS.

Realizing some members faced the greatest challenges during this trying time, God moved MemCom to take proactive action. MemCom offers help to those members and their families

who are most affected and in need by distributing basic food baskets that include rice, noodles, crackers, groceries, condiments, etc. on a quarterly basis.

Each year during Christmas, MemCom honors our elderly church members who are 80 years old and above with Christmas baskets. This is a token from the church to celebrate the lives of the elderly among us.

Recently, an elderly church member was admitted to the hospital two times due to different medical reasons. She is a 24-year cancer survivor, had been very disciplined in her diet, and had not been hospitalized all these years until October and November this year. As a result, she became unable to take care of herself in her own home. God burdened the hearts of MemCom members and empowered us with courage, patience, wisdom and strength to care for her, making sure that she has what she needs, constantly checking for diagnosis and medical advice from the doctors, caringly communicating with her caregivers for any instructions and update of her conditions, and most importantly of all, committing her to the Lord in prayers.

Praise God for His divine guidance and providence. She is now in the care of a nursing home. She is assisted by caregivers and attended by doctors and therapists. Her meals are all prepared for her. She can make friends with other residents of the nursing home and there are gardens where she can walk around and do daily exercise.

We are all in awe how this arrangement has come to be. We did not have the experience to care for an elderly church member. We did not know what to do when we started. As God burdened our hearts and entrusted

her into our care, He grew our love for her and led us to put our love into action. We witnessed how God leads our hearts and transforms our lives, causing our hearts to beat as one and our lips to be filled with praises and thanksgiving to Him.

I resorted to plan B and asked Angkong to meet my teachers for some "minor offenses." Without any hesitation and without asking any questions, Angkong agreed.

The teachers discussed with Angkong my misconduct, and that no amount of reprimand stopped me from my misdemeanors. Without any hint of judgment in his voice, Angkong called me and talked to me. He was always very tolerant of me. Always diplomatic in words and action, never raising his voice. He advised me to stop the pranks as it does not benefit me. "You reap what you sow," he reminded. His gentle words went a long way and had a bigger and more lasting effect than harsh words spoken in anger. His acceptance of me, regardless of faults, helped boost my confidence. Angkong believed that I had more to offer than just my pranks.

The times spent with my grandfather are the most treasured memories. Angkong's favorite movie was the Sound of Music. Climb Every Mountain was particularly his favorite song in the movie as it reminded him to continue climbing in spite of all the obstacles he faced.

Through all his life's challenges, he abhorred the use of the word "problem" because for him, problems do not exist. If things had solutions, they were not problems. If things did not have a solution, then he let them be.

During Typhoon Odette, he slept through the storm. He would not allow the typhoon to rob him of his sleep. All his life he would not allow himself to be possessed by fears, doubt, or bitterness. He filled his heart with feelings of love, peace, and joy. He entrusted the things he could not control to the Lord. He is truly the most optimistic person I know. His mindset is a game changer.

The most valuable lesson I learned from him is that our thoughts become our reality. Think of only the good, to create the best results.

Thank you Angkong for teaching this priceless lesson that reality can be changed by the power of our thoughts.

How do you measure a lifetime?

Christmas of 2021 was a mostly-somber affair, hosted in now-familiar isolation with global restrictions on travel still very much in effect. What should have been the hustle and bustle of the season visiting friends was instead spent online, with calls on Zoom to distant family half a world away. One of these sessions would see my heavily-pregnant wife and I reach out to someone I had not seen in person since 2019, my grandfather Valentin Uy. I didn't realize it at the time, but those parting words would be incredibly important to all of us.

Long after all the Christmas decor had come down and several difficult days of labor, my son Xavier Benjamin Uy was born. I would excitedly rush to call my Angkong; even over the grainy connection we could tell how proud he looked to see his great-grandson for the first time. But little did we know that it would be the only time. By the time my son was discharged from the maternity ward, my Angkong Valentin would be admitted into an ICU. Three tear-filled days later, under the watchful eyes of my cousins Erlyn and Ryan, I would sing 'How Great Thou Art' to him only minutes before he passed away.

I can say with confidence that my grandfather lived a good life; my Angkong's years were full and rich beyond compare. From his own personal stories, it has become apparent that close to a century of experiences left their mark upon him and those around him. I also have my own memories to call upon; I remember fondly those days he spent walking me to school in Canada, or singing to me at the dining room table in the Philippines.

My grandfather Valentin was blessed with a lifetime on this Earth. No more, no less. And for a brief moment, his long stay on Earth intersected with that of my son, because he waited, just like I'd asked. And I will treasure that moment, however short and fleeting, until the day I see him again.

My Angkong leaves behind a legacy of a Godly lifetime to his children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. I remain thankful for the testimony he impressed upon me, and remain prayerful for the day of our reunion. Until that day comes, I will tell my son the precious stories of my grandfather Valentin and sing the songs about the God he loved.

There are too many stories we can tell you about our dear Mother. Our Mother continues to inspire us in two ways to this day.

First, our Mother was made of steel. But she also had a heart of gold. She instilled in us discipline, internal self-worth and the true meaning of hard work. In our toughest times, Mother's words to us were simple and unforgettable: "we are materially poor, but we can never be spiritually poor". As we look back, we are always grateful for what Mother inculcated in all of us. Mother's message was always: never give up and it guided us to endure and overcome life's hardships.

Second, our Mother possesses an unyielding spirit as she faced life's challenges. Some years ago, we read these lines by Alfred Tennyson to a group of sisters in the Sisters Fellowship of Cebu Gospel Church during mother's 92nd birthday. They characterize our Mother's unyielding spirit and our family through the years. They remind us of how far we've travelled through life, and who we are as a family:

"Though much is taken, much abides;
And though we are not now that strength
which in old days
Moved earth and heaven, that which we are,
we are;

One equal temper of heroic hearts, Made weak by time and fate, but strong in will

To strive, to seek, to find, and not to yield. "

God has blessed our family with Mother's teachings, both in words and acts, for over 70 years. We remember our mother, by the grace of God, strong as steel and whose unyielding spirit to life is an invaluable legacy to us. As we look back, God has also blessed our Mother and our family with priceless encouragers and friends who journeyed with her and our family the past 72 years. Mother's life was filled with God's blessings. 1 Thessalonians 4:14 " For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep." Yes, mother is sleeping now. We all shall see her again.

uman life has always been in search for a joyful life. Some efforts used to describe what a joyful life is. It is fascinating to understand the unique nature of joy. It is a word that cannot be negated by simple prefixes to make it a negative word. You cannot say unjoy, disjoy, or maljoy. It can be negatively combined with another word to kill it (killjoy) or lose it (joyless). It can be positively intensified by joyful, enjoy and rejoice. True joy is something complete, regardless of human situation, something that is not rooted in the happenings of human life and is not affected by time -something outside of time and human achievements. Therefore, it is possible to be grieving and sorrowful yet rejoicing.

Even if it is God who gives joy (Ecc. 2:26), through the Messiah (Isa.61:3), and the Spirit's fruit (Gal. 5:22), borne by Gospel (Lk 2:10) and results of His Words (Neh. 8:12; Jer. 15:16), humans spent a lifetime to find it his own accomplishments and wealth and find it illusive, vanity - chasing after the wind (Ecc. 2:10,11). Human happiness does not last. To generate joy in oneself and hold on to it becomes a trap of an endless loop of struggles. They melt, expire, exhausted and come short, unless God have brought, given and man received and lived joy.

Human finds fleeting happiness in four things. There is a cone of icecream. A lick of material sweetness is happiness, yet so quick to melt and disappear. The feeling is gone, and you buy another toy, endlessly. Too much of it makes one sick. Then there is the trophy - a sense of accomplishment of hard work, launching one to the top, being more than all others. It too is a fleeting moment of joy that ends up a dusty corroded monument on the shelf, none will dare ask about. Furthermore, its tiring to prove oneself every time. Then comes the giving and blessing others by doing good to them. A spark of joy that is so addictive because it feels so good and so right. Selfless giving feels heroic until one realizes that he/she cannot be everything to anyone. Then the ministry of doing good becomes exhausting and frustrating when one becomes the messiah to another. Finally human found that true joy is something not in this world, a reaching out to grab it, is needed. - She was obedient to God's will and willing to be conceived by the Holy Spirit and to give birth to the Holy Son, Jesus
- Her reputation and life were at risk if she was conceived before marriage. Joseph may abandon her and people will stone her to death
- She was mentioned twice in the Bible first, at the wedding feast in Cana and second, when Jesus was crucified on the cross on Calvary.

His role in Christmas:

the Obedient One of Christ's birth

Joseph took Mary to be his wife in obedience to the Lord's command through Angel Gabriel. (Mat. 1:18-24)

Lesson to learn:

The Word of God is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. We must follow His righteous laws and submit to God's will. (Ps. 119:105)

the Offeror One of Christ's birth

Mary offered her body to fulfill God's plan of salvation. The Holy Spirit will come upon her and the Most High will overshadow her. And she will give birth to the Holy Son of God. (Luke 1:26-35)

Lesson to learn:

We must offer our bodies as a living sacrifice to God for His use. (Romans 12:1)



Angels

- When Jezebel was about to kill Elijah, Elijah fled for his life to the wilderness. There, an angel touched him, saying, "Get up and eat!".(1 Kings 19:5-8).
- When Daniel was in the lion's den, God sent messengers to seal the lion's mouth. (Dan.
 6:22)
- After Jesus was tempted by the devil, the devil left Jesus and an angel came to serve him.
 (Mat 4:11)
- When Jesus prayed in Gethsemane, an angel appeared from heaven and strengthened Him. (Luke 22:43)
- The angels announced the birth of Jesus to the shepherds. (Luke 2:8-12)
- When Peter was imprisoned, the angel of the Lord opened the prison door during the night and led him out of prison. (Acts 5:19)
- The angel of God stood by Paul by night and said to him, "Do not be afraid, for you will surely stand before Caesar;" (Acts 27:23-24)
- And a messenger came to Cornelius, and told him to send someone to Joppa, and to ask
 Simon, who was called Peter, to come to his house. (Acts 10:3-6)



His role in Christmas: The Messenger of Christ's birth

The angels gave the glad tidings to the shepherds. (Luke 2:8-12)

Lesson to learn:

There are many people who do not know the true God. We need to spread the gospel to show our love and care.



Shepherds

- They were considered unclean, uneducated, lowly, and despised by society. But the sheep represents Jesus as the Lamb of the world.
- The angels gave them a direct sign of the birth of Christ.

His role in Christmas:

The Witnesses of Christ's birth

The angels gave the glad tidings to the shepherds. (Luke 2:8-12)

Lesson to learn:

There are many people who do not know the true God. We need to spread the gospel to show our love and care.

The Magi

- They came from the East to worship the King of Judah.
- They brought gold, frankincense, and myrrh to Jesus.

His role in Christmas: The Worshipers of Christ's birth

The Magi fell down and worshipped Jesus. They presented Him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Mat. 2:9-12)

Lesson to learn:

All what we have is given by God. Therefore, we should give our money, time, and talents to Him. We must worship and praise Him wholeheartedly.





King Herod

- He was called Herod the Great.
- He had 3 sons: Archelaus, Herod Antipas and Philip.
- He ordered all the boys which is 2 years old and under in Bethlehem to be killed.

His role in Christmas: The Destroyer of Christ's birth

King Herod was disturbed, and told the Magi to find the child and report to him. But the Magi were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod. When King Herod realized he was outwitted by the Magi, he was furious and gave orders to kill all the boys, which were two years old and under in Bethlehem and within its vicinity. (Mat. 2:3-16)

Pesson to learn:

Three bible stories showed us the results of jealousy. Cain murdered His brother Abel. Joseph's brother sold him as a slave to Potiphar, one of Pharaoh's official, the captain of the guard. King Herod the Great killed all babies two years and under. Jealousy leads to anger, anger to hatred and hatred to death. Therefore, we must not harbor jealousy in our hearts.

Simeon

- He was a righteous and godly man in Jerusalem, and he was able to meet Joseph, Mary, and Jesus in the temple.
- He hoped that he would meet Jesus before he died.
- After he met Jesus, he asked God to let him rest in peace.
- He considered Jesus to be the light of the Gentiles and the glory of the Jews.

His role in Christmas: The High Hope of Christ's birth

When Simeon's hope of seeing the child was fulfilled, he asked the Lord to dismiss him in peace. (Luke 2:25-32)



Pesson to learn:

The signs of Christ's second coming are: earthquakes, diseases, famines, wars, lightnings, thunders, hailstorms. All these events are happening now. Therefore, we must watch and pray, and prepare our hearts to meet the Lord anytime.



Lesson to learn:

Anna the Prophetess

- She was an elderly woman of the tribe of Asher.
- She was widowed after seven years of marriage until she was eighty-four years old.
- She worshipped, fasted and prayed day and night without ever leaving the temple.

His role in Christmas: The Minister of Christ's birth

She thanked God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem. (Luke 2:38)

Every believer should attend church worship service regularly. He must have a daily devotion by studying the Bible and fellowship with God to live a holy and victorious life.



John the Baptist

- He prepared the way for Jesus.
- He preached the message of repentance, confession, and baptism.
- He was a humble man who said, "I baptize you with water, but there is one coming who is more powerful than I. I am not worthy to untie his sandals, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." (Luke 3:16)

John the Baptist preached repentance in the wilderness, prepared the way for the Lord, straightened His path, and baptized Jesus. (Matt 3:1-l7)

John the Baptist served the Lord faithfully. He humbled himself and confessed that Jesus is more powerful than him. He preached the message of repentance boldly. Let us follow his virtues of faithfulness, humility and courage. Let us be Christians with good testimonies that are pleasing to God.

These are the major characters responsible for making nativity the greatest and most wonderful story ever told. To all of us who believe that nativity is an occasion and time for service, obedience, offering, love, care, witness, worship, hope, devotion, faithfulness, humility, and courage, we can become part of the story! Let us do our role in expanding the kingdom of God.
